

Heresy: How to Navigate It. (Part 2)

Paul said that there "must also be heresies" among God's people, "that they which are approved may be made manifest". (1 Cor 11:19). Paul also teaches us in his letter to Timothy that to be approved has to do with how we "study" and how we apply and share "the word of truth" (2 Tim 2:15). When we further study this text in connection with other scriptures, we find that the Bible summarises being 'approved' as referring to those who:

- 1. Understand the truth (2 Tim 2:7)
- 2. Love the truth (2 Thess 2:10)
- 3. Live the truth (1 John 2:6)

Before continuing on to our second point, there is a worthy point to make: someone can have an intellectual "understanding" of the truth, and can supposedly be "living the truth" but at the same time have no love for the truth.

Wasn't that true of the Pharisees? Boy, did they know their Bibles! Boy, did they follow the letter of the law to the T! But what did Jesus say about them?

'Hypocrites!... 'These people draw near to Me with their mouth, And honor Me with their lips, But their heart is far from Me.' Matt 15:7-8

Their heart was far from Jesus. They didn't love the Truth.

This was my experience growing up as a Seventh-day Adventist. I understood some things in my mind, and knew that I needed to put on a good show, but I had fixed my heart on the things of this world. Interestingly, people today have also gone to the other extreme, and thrown out a correct 'understanding of the truth' and the need to 'live the truth', all in the name of loving Jesus who is the truth. What confusion. How sad! Both are wrong.

This is why it is crucial that we have an experience with

Jesus in all three areas, that we may be approved!

Continuing on from last month, then, we need to...

2. LOVE THE TRUTH (2 Thess 2:10)

'The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders, and with all unrighteous deception among those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth, that they might be saved.'

Did you catch it?

Those who fall for the deceptions, and heresies, in the end don't actually have a 'love of the truth'. And notice: receiving a love of the truth is a necessary part of being saved. Wow!

Loving the truth, or in other words, loving Jesus (Jn 14:6), is crucial. When we love the truth, we will love every part of God's word (Jn 17:17). Will someone say, 'Amen!? And when we love the truth, we will see Jesus at the heart of every doctrine and teaching of scripture (John 5:39). Just think about it! Every doctrine of the scriptures is like a photo frame. The teachings are the frame, while JESUS is the picture!

But do we love Him?

Consider this quote from the Spirit of Prophecy, and ask yourself the question, 'Is my answer "Jesus"?'

"Who has the heart? With whom are our thoughts? Of whom do we love to converse? Who has our warmest affections and our best energies? If we are Christ's, our thoughts are with Him, and our sweetest thoughts are of Him. All we have and are is consecrated to Him. We long to bear His image, breathe His spirit, do His will, and please Him in all things." (SC, p. 58)
